Typical tasks will include:

Statutory Duties

- Ensuring that the organisation complies with its governing document, employment law and any other relevant legislation or regulations.
- Ensure that the organisation pursues its objectives as defined in its governing document. Ensure the organisation uses its resources exclusively in achieving its objectives
- Contribute actively as a Trustee by giving firm strategic direction to the organisation, setting overall policy, defining goals, setting targets and evaluating performance against agreed targets, in partnership with the rest of the Trustees.
- Safeguard the good name and values of the organisation.
- Represent The Cellar Trust at functions and meetings as appropriate.
- Declare any conflict of interest while carrying out the duties of a trustee.
- Be collectively responsible for the actions of the organisation and other trustees. Ensure the effective and efficient administration of the organisation.
- Abide by the Equity, Diversity & Inclusion Policy and all other relevant policies and procedures Ensure the financial stability of the organisation.
- Protect and manage the property of the organisation and to ensure the proper investment of the organisation's funds.
- Ensure that the organisation is properly insured against all reasonable liabilities. The Board of Trustees retains overall responsibility for risk management and regularly reviews the charity's processes for identifying, prioritising, escalating and managing risks.
- Appoint and support the CEO and monitor their performance.
